Ohio Revised Code (ORC) 3314.03(D)(2) specifies that the sponsor of the school must "monitor and evaluate the academic and fiscal performance and the organization and operation of the community school on at least an annual basis."

Buckeye Community Hope Foundation (BCHF) bases its evaluation of school performance on each of the State required indicators and performance measures listed in the charter contract. BCHF monitors the performance of the community school thru attendance at board meetings, bi-monthly visits to the school, monthly reviews of financial reports and quarterly reviews of academic progress reports along with a number of other reports relative to the schools performance. Buckeye Community Hope Foundation served as the sponsor for Main Preparatory Academy during the 2021-2022 school year, and found the school substantially compliant with the rules and regulations governing community schools and progressing towards compliant in academics.

All community school sponsors are required to submit a written report of the evaluation results of the school's academic, financial, and organization performance as well as the school's legal compliance to the Ohio Department of Education and make the report available to parents of students enrolled in the community school. 


By June of 2024 and each year following, scholars will improve passage rates on the Ohio State Test in English/Language Arts and Mathematics by 1-3%.

By June of 2024 and each year following, 100% of teachers will have a 75% positivity percentage recorded by Kickboard Staff Interactions.


